DOM §52100.1 Policy

Penal Code (PC) Section 314 defines Indecent Exposure [IEX] as “the willful and lewd exposure of a person, or the private parts thereof, in any public place or in any place where there are present other persons to be offended or annoyed there-

by.” Sexual Disorderly Conduct [SDC] is defined in California Code of Regulations (CCR) Section 3000 as “every person who touches, without exposing, their genitals, buttocks or breasts in a manner, or other circumstance of this touching,

that demonstrates it is for the purpose of sexual arousal, gratification, annoyance, or offense, and that any reasonable person would consider this conduct offensive.”

DOM §52100.2 Purpose

To ensure that every [IEX] or [SDC] incident is reported, tracked, managed, subject to discipline, and referred for prosecution as set forth in

this policy. An inmate who engages in [IEX] or [SDC] shall be subject to a variety of Security Measures in an attempt to identify, prevent, re-

duce, and eliminate the opportunity to repeat the behavior.

DOM §52100.4 Security Measures

Inmates who engage in acts of [IEX] or [SDC] will be subject to Security Measures that are designed to decrease the opportunity for the inmate to repeat the behavior and/or minimize the impact that the behavior has on prison staff and others. Security Measures are tools used by staff for a determinate period to identify, prevent, reduce, and eliminate behavior.

Security Precautions
Solid door with yellow

placard, cell and/or side-window covering, or other devices primarily used to alert staff of an inmate’s propensity to engage in [IEX] or [SDC] behavior and secondarily used to limit the inmate’s ability to observe staff while engaging in the behavior.

Yellow Cell Front Coverings:

The placement of yellow cell front coverings is mandatory for all [IEX] and [SDC] offenses as a Security Precaution.

The reporting employee

may initiate this Security Precaution immediately.

For the first offense the yellow cell covering shall be applied for 90 days from the date of offense.

For a second offense within 12 months from the most recent offense, or while on yellow cell front status, the inmate will be placed on yellow cell front status for 6 months from the most recent offense, which will run concurrent with the existing precaution.
